Market Perspective. The markets moved little for the week. The DOW was down 0.2%, but the S&P was up 0.6% and the NASDAQ was up 1%. All three are down slightly YTD. Market direction in the first weeks of the year has some correlation with the year's performance.

The weak jobs creation numbers moved interest rates down (bond prices up) on Friday. All in all, 2014 market performance has given few hints of what the year will be like.
