That optimism then faded, with predictions that economic recovery would be slow and uneven. For the week, the DOW was up 3.3%; the S&P up 3.2%; and the NASDAQ up 3.4%. What will happen in states that are reopening? When can we go back to restaurants?

Topics this Week

<u>2020 RMD Strategies</u>. With RMDs not required for 2020, do you plan to change what you do, if you do not needs RMDs for living expenses? Changes can be driven by whether you itemize deductions of take the standard deduction, use of Qualified Charitable Deductions, and conversions to Roth IRAs. Also reversal of distributions already taken in 2020.

Bob Baker look at buys and sells. We want to hear from the buyers and sellers on the reasons for your decisions.
